TGCC set up a subsidiary in Gabon following a successful partnership made possible by synergies between human and equipment resources and the temporary assignment of skilled employees to work with local teams. In 2015, TGCC launched another subsidiary, in Côte d'Ivoire, to export its expertise and become a leading local actor while mindful of its commitment to deliver quality projects safely and on time.

Most recently, the creation of TGCC Sénégal in 2018 reaffirmed its ambition to become a leader in the market. In a country with strong cultural connections and proud historical ties with Morocco, this operation will create beneficial synergies for the Group and be a key driver of its development in Morocco and Senegal.

OUR MAJOR PROJECTS



ANFAPLACE

- Casablanca

AnfaPlace is located in central Casablanca, on boulevard de la Corniche (Ain Diab). It has a surface area of 9.3 hectares.

The site brings together prestigious housing units, a Four Seasons luxury hotel, shops, offices, leisure facilities and a financial and business centre. The project encompasses:

- AnfaPlace Shopping Center: 36,000 m² of shops and dining and leisure services, and a large car park
- AnfaPlace Business Center: more than 16,000 m² of fully equipped open-plan offices with multiple layouts
- AnfaPlace Living Center contains a luxury hotel with 234 rooms, conference centre, 104 tourist apartments, 260 prestigious apartments, and more

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MAVENUE

- Marrakesh

The M Avenue is a 110,000 m² project with a 500-metrelong avenue between the Jardins de la Ménara and the Palais des Congrès, via the Four Seasons.

The project comprises 96 luxury Four Seasons apartments:

- 18,000 m² of shops and businesses
- a Pestana CR7 hotel with 174 rooms
- two restaurants
- a business centre
- a spa
- 3,000 m² of offices
- 3,000 m² of exhibition and events spaces
- 2,000 m² of well-being and health facilities
- 10,000 m² of greenery











BOUSKOURA GOLF CITY

- Bouskoura

Bouskoura Golf City is a residential and tourist complex owned by Prestigia. It has a surface area of more than 220 hectares and comprises apartments, luxury villas, business premises and a club house on the golf course.

The project encompasses:

- phase 1: 224 villas on an 80,000 m² site
- phase 2: 46 villas on a 15,993 m² site
- phase 3: 153 apartments on a 39,300 m² site
- phase 4: 99 apartments on a 22,436 m² site
- phase 5: 108 apartments on a 22,717 m² site
- an ACIMA shopping centre on a 3,624 m² site
- a club house on a 4,028 m² site
- 136 villas in the forest city on a 37,765 m² site



TERMINAL 1 EXTENSION MOHAMMED V AIRPORT

- Nouaceur

The extension of Terminal 1 at Casablanca Mohammed V International Airport included the upgrading of the former passenger terminal on an all-trades basis over a 12,000 m² site (halls) and a three-floor development area (42,000 m²).

The extension is set to double the number of passengers passing through Mohammed V airport.



TANGIER STADIUM

- Tangier

Ten kilometres from the city centre, Tangier grand stadium has a seating capacity for 45,000 people and includes:

- athletics track
- multicoloured terrace seating

The size, scale and location of the project was a technical challenge, making it a particularly impressive achievement.

STADIUM EXTENSION

- Tangier

The current contract relates to construction work on an extension of the Tangier grand stadium and concerns the following trades:

- carcassing
- steel structure
- waterproofing
- flooring and walls
- suspended ceilings
- aluminium, metal and wood joinery
- painting
- external features
- electricity (high/low voltage)
- fluids





CASA PORT TRAIN STATION

- Casablanca

The new Casa Port train station is part of a large-scale infrastructure construction and modernisation programme designed to better serve ONCF customers and convey a modern image of Morocco. The new station replaces the former station building and is large enough to handle some 10 million passengers annually, with 5,000 passengers an hour at peak times. There are also plans to build a link to the city's future regional railway network.

The new station has a covered surface area of approximately $33,500 \text{ m}^2$ including:

- a building (ground floor + 6) for shops and businesses and 3,500 m² of office space, and two lower-ground floors for technical facilities covering an area of 1,000 m²
- a 3,800 m² esplanade
- a 7,000 m² covered ground floor
- 355 m² of ticket offices
- 650 m² of shops
- first lower-ground floor containing a shopping mall of approximately
- 8,400 m²
- second and third lower-ground floors with 15,500 m² of equipped space



TANGER CITY CENTER

- Tangier

Tanger City Center is a complex on a 236,443 m² site in central Tangier, on the city's main boulevard, close to the sea. It is a large-scale mixed-use project composed of:

- 800 apartments
- two 4- and 5-star hotels with an overall capacity of approximately 1,500 beds
- office floors with a surface area of 10,151 m²
- a shopping centre of approximately 32,000 m²

The project has several high-rise buildings, requiring the use of special equipment and the implementation of precise procedures.



CARRÉ EDEN

- Marrakesh

Located in central Marrakesh, in the district of Guéliz, with a surface area of 98,500 m², Carré Eden is a mixed-use project composed of:

- three buildings with 80 luxury apartments
- a shopping centre on three levels and a 14,000 m² retail space with a supermarket and traditional market
- a 5-star hotel with 204 rooms and a swimming pool
- a car park with 736 spaces over four levels



AGADIR UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL

- Agadir

Under plans to develop the Moroccan health sector, the Agadir University Hospital is being built on a 30-hectare site with:

- a covered floor surface of 130,000 m²
- a car park with 1,000 spaces
- a capacity for 864 beds
- a multi-speciality hospital:
 - mother and child (maternity)
 - technical support centre (radiology, scanner, MRI)
 - hospital admissions
 - ambulance, respectful maternity care
- residential centre



GRAND THEATRE

- Casablanca

The construction of the Grand Theatre of Casablanca is intended to drive the cultural and tourism development of Morocco and particularly the Greater Casablanca region.

A performance space for national and international works and shows, CasArts aims to be an engine of artistic development by promoting local productions and cooperation with other Moroccan and international cultural centres and actors.

Located on Mohammed V square in the historic centre of Casablanca, the theatre has a surface area of 24,000 m^2 and eight levels with:

- a 1,800-seat auditorium
- a 600-seat theatre
- a 450-seat concert hall
- a rehearsal room
- an artist's village with changing areas and services
- technical facilities
- shops and businesses
- offices



HIGH-SPEED TRAIN LINE MAINTENANCE DEPOT

- Tangier

The Tangier high-speed train line maintenance depot principally services a fleet of 30 state-of-the-art LGV (High Speed Line) trains.

It is the only project of its kind in Africa and spans 12.5 hectares, including 1.7 covered hectares and 10.8 hectares of external amenities (car parks, green spaces, tracks etc.).





TGV LINE

- Rabat

The Tangier/Casablanca high-speed train line project involved constructing a 200-kilometre double-rail track from Tangier to Kenitra to allow for train speeds of up to 350 km/h. The new line complies with TSI (technical specifications for interoperability) standards applied on European and international networks. TGCC was contracted to construct the following:

- 2 landing stages, 400 metres long
- 4 road bridges
- 5 rail bridges
- 1 footbridge
- 8 hydraulic works (box culverts)

RABAT AGDAL - TGV STATION

- Rabat

The new Rabat Agdal train station with 23,000 m² of passenger buildings is now an engine of the capital's urban development. External amenities include 58,000 m² of green spaces, footpaths, fountains and play areas.

The contract to design and construct the new station was awarded on an all-trades basis and the project complies with the latest environmental standards. It also includes:

- offices and businesses
- a floor of cafés and restaurants
- a 12,000 m² pedestrianised esplanade covering the train tracks with six 400-metre-long platforms and 10 tracks
- an 800-space car park on a 34,000 m² site
- VIP rooms





MOHAMMED VI TOWER

- Rabat

The cornerstone of the Bouregreg Valley development programme, the tower is part of a riverside regeneration and promotion project and aims to provide the inhabitants of Rabat with a pleasant living environment.

The Mohammed VI tower will meet the highest international environmental quality standards and reduce stress on the environment as part of an improved designed in line with HQE and LEED GOLD certification requirements.

The tower is 250 metres tall and has 51 floors (50 habitable floors below a Mezzanine and roof deck with technical facilities, storeroom and two cradles). These floors are divided into:

- offices: GF to GF+13
- apartments: GF+14 to GF+28 and GF+47 to GF+50
- hotel: GF+29 to R+46

The tower stands at the centre of a podium with a conference centre, restaurants, spa and swimming pool for public use. The tower and podium share the basement level with a 629-space car park, 26 lower-ground spaces for bicycles and motorbikes and 63 ground-floor spaces.



HEAD OFFICE OF THE NATIONAL PROPERTY REGISTRY, LAND REGISTRY AND CARTOGRAPHY AGENCY

- Rabat

The Head Office of the National Property Registry, Land Registry and Cartography Agency is the largest administrative head office in Africa. An 80,000 m² complex in Hay Riad, Rabat, it has seven towers with seven to fifteen floors and two lower-ground floors, divided as follows:

- Tower 1: management
- Tower 2: property registry
- Tower 3: cartography
- Tower 4: human resources
- Tower 5: logistics and general affairs
- Tower 6: land registry
- Tower 7: payroll and finance

The project also includes a central mall giving access to a conference room and car parks on two lower-ground floors.
